MONTGOMERY PLACE

Montgomery Place is one of the most significant and historically preserved country estates in America. Set amidst 434 acres of rolling lawns, woodlands, and glorious gardens, this National Historic Landmark includes an elegant mansion designed by A.J. Davis, America's greatest mid-19th century architect. Scenic views of the Hudson River and of the Catskill Mountains beyond are unforgettable. But it is the

chance to really experience life as it was lived during the era of the "Great Estates" in the Hudson River Valley that will linger in your memory.

Stroll through the gardens and the restored greenhouse. The horticulturist staff will be delighted to answer your questions. Take a walk along a woodland trail to the falls of the Sawkill.

Pick your own fresh fruit in the orchards. Spread out a blanket on the lawn and enjoy a picnic, or pull up a chair on the north porch and just relax.

The gift and garden shop offers a selection of books, garden supplies, children's games, and more. Combine your visit with a stop in the nearby towns of Blitworth, or Red Hook, where you will find antique shops, bed and breakfasts, and fine restaurants.

Directions:
From the New York State Thruway (I-87) take exit 19 for Kingston onto Route 209/199 east across the Kingston-Rhinecliff Bridge. Take a left on Route 9G and travel 3 miles, then left again on Annandale Road, bearing left onto River Road to the estate entrance. From the Taconic State Parkway take the Pine Plains/Red Hook exit for Route 199. Proceed west 10 miles on Route 199 through Red Hook, right on Route 9G, and left on Annandale Road as above.
